The three youngest children, Ramees 13, Shantal 10 and Shannel 15, came to stay at My Father's House for a short time to provide some financial relief for the family and freeing Angie to visit Dale in the hospital. Dale ended up being in the hospital for ten weeks!

Jim & Penie visited with the family when Dale returned home from the hospital. We deliver uniforms, shoes and school books to the children. All the supplies were purchased with funds that Dustin, a 13 year old boy from Cin., OH, raised upon his return home! Dustin, being a cancer survivor himself, was moved by Dale's plight of a lengthy stay in the hospital. With tears in his eyes, Dale expressed his thanks with much emotion. "While I was in the hospital, all I could think of was that I needed to be working so that the kids would go to school this year. I usually work extra all summer so they can have books and what they need to start school in September, and all I could do was lay there and pray. I asked God to help me. He has supplied better than I ever have!"



The communities of Petersville and Gully Bank were blessed by our teams this summer. Each team brought activities for the children planting seeds of God's love in their hearts. It always amazes us how a simple coloring activity can be treasured so greatly by the children as well as many adults who attend the Bible School sessions offered by the groups. Such an adventure is a great undertaking with socialized medicine. Because it's not "critical," care is difficult to find. We were very much blessed by **Myles, Cin., OH** who served as an intern at My Father's House this summer. Myles helped in numerous ways, but our favorite by far was his input during worship. Thanks Myles!
